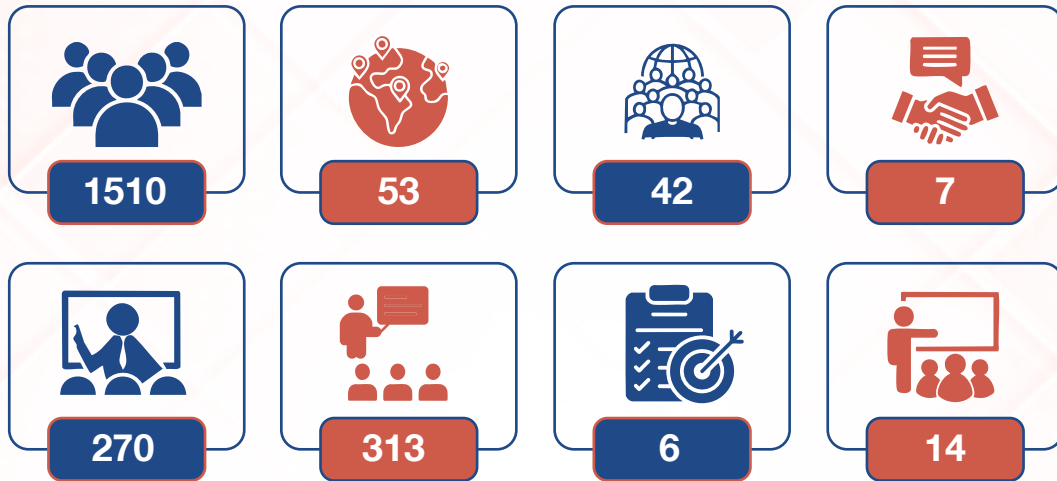

Conference Highlights

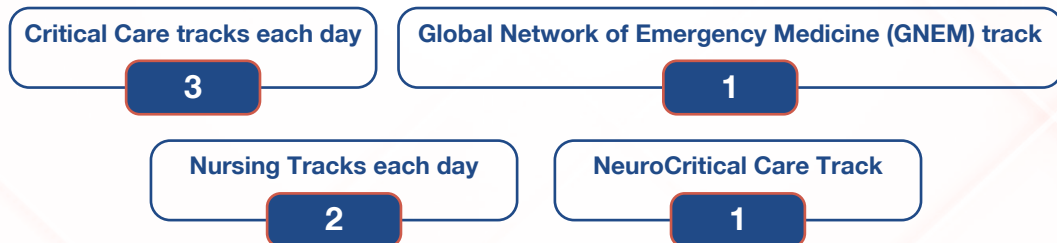
The 21st Emirates Critical Care Conference was organized for three days from May 9th to 11th at the Event Centre, InterContinental Hotel, Dubai Festival City, Dubai, UAE.

The conference attracted a total of **1,510 participants** from **53 countries**. It received endorsements from **42 societies** and federations and was further supported by **7 media partners**.

A total of **270 faculty members** participated of which **126 were international**, **60 regional** and **84 local speakers** whose dedication and invaluable contributions were instrumental in the success of the scientific program.



The 3-day scientific program included **6 Tracks** covering **313 lectures**, incorporating the following subspecialty tracks within **60 sessions**:

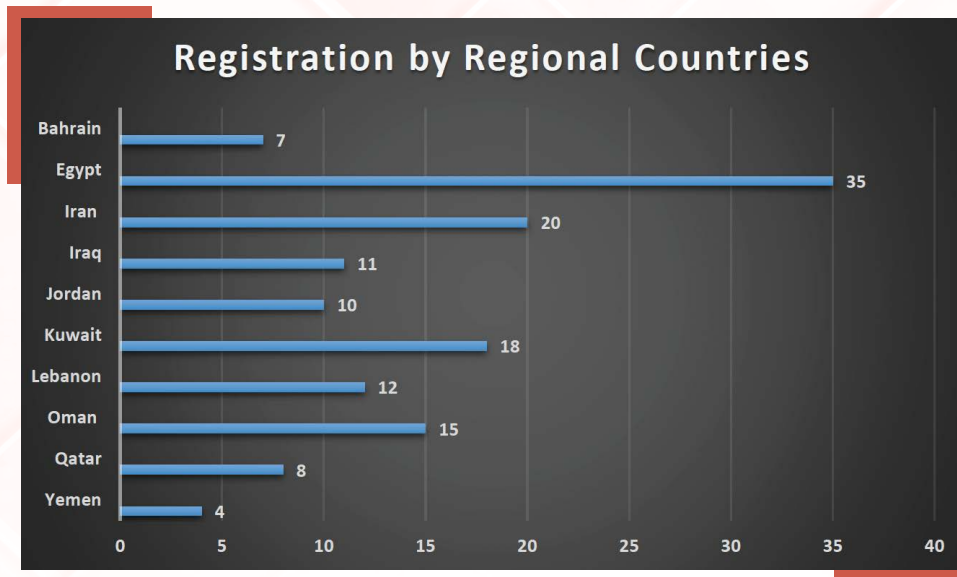

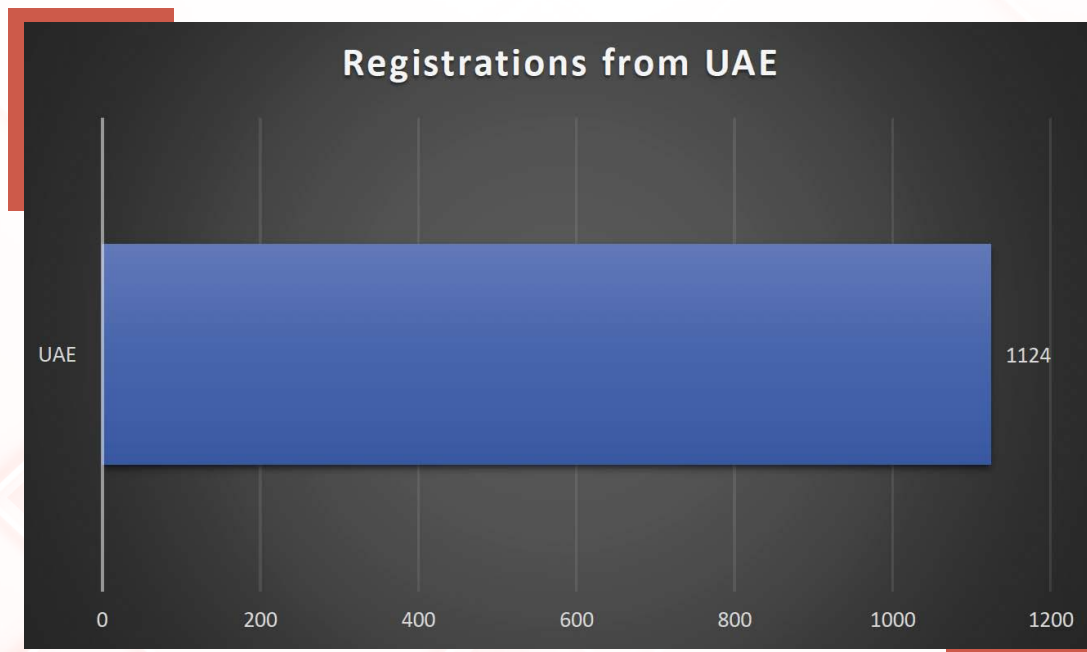
Registration Overview by International Countries

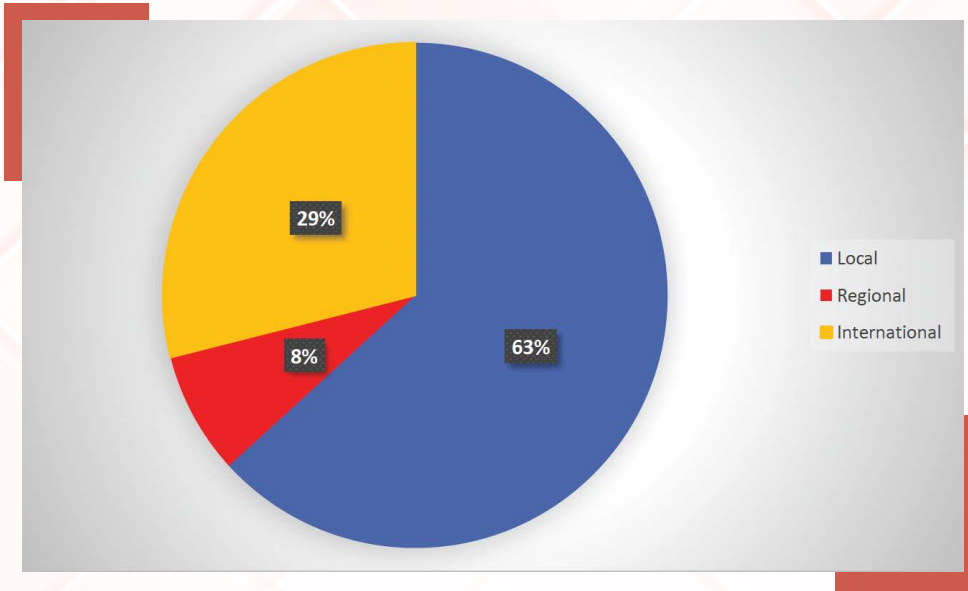


Registrations by Regional Countries
